Institutional Social Responsibility

Recognizing the need of Social responsibility, Our Institute is proactively dedicated towards contributing in philanthropy and social concerns. To meet purpose, Institute focuses on and practices all possible ways.

Institute organizes Plantation Programme, involving all the members of the Institute, intermittently. Blood donation camps are organized frequently in the Institute in which great participation from all staff and students is visible every time. Also, blood group testing camps are organized specially for testing “sickle- cell”, a disease which is widely spread in the region.

College has adopted two villages where in awareness programmes, free distribution of general medicines, cleaning and other such assistance has provided. College provides donations to “Antarkala Parishad”, an NGO for differently abled children.

Camps for NSS and NCC are frequently organized. Their activities like volunteering in traffic management and awareness programme add value to the sublimity and grandeur of Institute.



